

Ft Howard Guard House—a series of articles in 2011 will examine this interesting building

The 1833 Fort Howard Guard house is an original structure which was moved to 410 Bond Street in the mid 1860s after the Fort was decommissioned and the railroad was built through the Fort site.

The Guard House was moved to Heritage Hill in December, 2009. It sits on a temporary site allowing ongoing research and the development of an interpretation and Restoration plan.

As the research, continues several interesting observations have been made during recent exploratory work on the Structure.



Clap board siding was uncovered while removing modern drywall from an area of the house that was long ago

converted to a bedroom. The siding that was determined to be of the Fort Howard period runs uninterrupted from the floor to the underside of the roof rafters, indicating this wall was the outside wall of the 1833 porch and had no porch ceiling.

More importantly, this information verifies that the wall had no window, which is consistent with Fort Howard Military Documents for the structure. The encapsulated siding also has several names written in pencil and current efforts are being made to read these.

Remnants of wood framing within the guardhouse attic suggest the location of the original chimney which is seen in an 1860's photo of the partially disassembled Fort Howard.

The building has a long history that will take some time to sort through.

In the coming months, the chronology of the physical changes that were made throughout the structure will be determined and we will identify what materials have been altered or are not of the Fort Howard time period.
